Kids will be wowed by Princesses and Superhero characters who will be walking throughout town all day and they'll also have the opportunity to meet Northwich's brand new mascot, Mrs Salt.

Designed by 7 year-old Connie Shrieves, who won the Christmas Extravaganza Mascot Competition, Mrs Salt loves all things Northwich and will add fun and excitement to proceedings.





As well as this, a whole host of animals will be in town, bringing intrigue and wonder.

The Exotic Mini Zoo Exhibit will return to Weaver Square where you can 'Meet a Meerkat' and Pocket Park will be the location of 'Sam's Scales 'N' Tails Reptile Exhibit' where you can take a look at the terrapins and view a range of other quirky animals.

Positively, 2016 has already seen one major project completed to better Northwich's aesthetics thanks to funding secured by the BID and Cheshire West and Chester Council (CWAC) from Central Government.

Pocket Park, an area of land next to Imperial Buildings on the High Street, has been transformed into a peaceful and tranquil haven by Groundwork CLM's landscaping team.

What was once scrubland is now the ideal place for relaxation and contemplation with the Park featuring beautifully crafted timber benches, trees and ornamental shrub planting; it's perfect for escaping to during lunch or quickly catching up

with friends away from the hustle and bustle of the town centre.

Officially launched at an opening ceremony held on Thursday 28th April, Pocket Park has really helped revitalise that particular area of Northwich.



On top of this, the BID is set to help better the town's image further by carrying out floral planting around Northwich.

At the southern edge of the site, on the banks of the River Weaver, the stateof-the-art five screen Odeon Cinema looks equally as eye-catching.

All the glass panels have been installed as well as the ornate black cladded brickwork, and steps up to the building are in the process of being erected; it's really starting to take shape now!
