The Charlatans give Northwich a buzz

Northwich was in the national spotlight in May thanks to The Charlatans, with the town benefiting from an upturn in visitors both on the streets and online.

NorthbyNorthwich, which saw the famous band play a series of gigs alongside numerous activities across the town, drove a footfall increase of over 6% when compared to the previous week and significantly boosted evening visitors too.

Concert nights saw footfall rise by over 100% as people not only came into Northwich to watch the gigs, but also visited the town's bars, pubs and restaurants to enjoy live music, food and drink.

The BID also noted huge spikes on their social platforms over the ten day event, most notably on their Visit Northwich Facebook page. Posts reached over 30,000 people while just over 11,000 Facebook users engaged with content over the course of the festival.

Over 15,000 people viewed videos from The Charlatans and various bands playing at venues such as The Salty Dog, The Salthouse NW, The Witton Chimes and Northwich Plaza, as the spotlight shone on Northwich.

The town even featured on regional television too as film crews rolled into Northwich to speak to the band, businesses and fans.

Northwich BID Manager Jane Hough has hailed NorthbyNorthwich as a huge success and believes the positivity surrounding the event will leave a lasting legacy.

"The vibe in Northwich throughout the whole festival was electric and it was great to see so many visitors coming to the town, experiencing everything Northwich has to offer and making memories they won't forget.



"As well as interacting with the public each and every day, the band really did everything they could to include the town's traders, as was shown by events and initiatives at The Seafarer, The Salty Dog, Barons Quay, The ODEON, The Salthouse NW, The Gladstone Club, The Witton Chimes and Northwich Library."

Northwich to be blooming lovely this summer

Northwich will be filled with colour and creativity this summer as the town enters the North West in Bloom competition.

Partnership working between the Northwich Business Improvement District (BID), Northwich Town Council, Cheshire West and Chester Council, Barons Quay, Northwich Rotary Club, Grozone Community Garden, local schools and the Drastic on Plastic initiative has seen Northwich start to be transformed thanks to planting, activities and community engagement throughout July and August.

Hanging and railing baskets are being filled with vibrant plants, specially designed floral motifs have been laid and bedded in the town centre and events will take place at various locations in the town including Barons Quay.

To complement this, the BID are also liaising with retailers regarding a shop window competition, with businesses being encouraged to design and create their own unique displays to tie in with the 'In Bloom' theme.

Two retailers, Crafty Stitches and Northwich Art Shop, have already got involved in the competition, adding colour and vividness to their premises.

Crafty Stitches' staff and customers have knitted hanging baskets and a unique archway which are adorning the front of their shop, while the Art Shop has beautiful baskets outside their store too.

Northwich, which is entering both the BID and Large Town Centre categories, will be visited for judging on Monday 6th August, when representatives from North West in Bloom will be taken on a tour of



the town and sightseeing tour of the different elements included in Northwich's entry.

BID Manager Jane Hough is looking forward to helping co-ordinate Northwich's 'In Bloom' entry and seeing the town coming together once again to help raise its profile.

"After months of planning and preparation, it's great to start seeing sections of our activity coming together. There is going to be so much colour and creativity on show across the whole town for visitors, shoppers and residents to enjoy.

"This project is another great example of partnership working within the town between different organisations and our businesses too and I'm confident it will give the town's profile another boost. Hopefully we can secure a good score from the judges – we certainly feel as though we've got a comprehensive and well-planned entry."

Festival of Arts unleashes town's creativity

reativity and artistic talent is on show at the Northwich Festival of Arts 2018 this July.

Main organisers Northwich Business Improvement District (BID) have compiled a varied and extensive list of performers and activities, with the event aiming to showcase and celebrate the culture, art and diversity present in Northwich.

BID Manager Jane Hough has revealed what visitors throughout the monthlong event can look forward to.

"Everything kicks off on Sunday 1st July when the Northwich Art Trail, organised by Visual Arts Cheshire, launches across the town and this is followed on Saturday 7th July by Northwich Art Shop's Grand Day Out at the Memorial Court.

"Later in the month, the Northwich River Festival is guaranteed to wow the crowds too and having seen what the Northwich Rotary Club has got lined up for the weekend of the 14th and 15th July, it's definitely worth popping in the diary."



As well as these events, the Northwich Festival of Arts also comprises a wide range of shows, exhibitions and workshops, shining the spotlight on talented individuals and organisations from Northwich and wider Mid Cheshire, as Jane explains.

"Following many different applications to perform at the festival, we are very pleased with the line-up which includes activities from the creative mediums of art, music, dance, poetry, sculpture and writing, with different elements for people of all ages.

"The BID wanted to ensure this event

brought something a little different to Northwich and I believe visitors and residents will enjoy the variety of what has been lined up."

Northwich River Festival set to make a splash

The countdown is now well and truly on to the Northwich River Festival which takes place on Saturday 14th and Sunday 15th July.

Following on from last year's success, event organisers the Northwich Rotary Club have compiled a jam-packed list of events and entertainment to bring in the crowds.

The hugely popular Dragon Boat racing will return, alongside raft races, but this year's event will also see the addition of concerts in Barons Quay's riverside park which opened at the end of June.

'Party in the Park' will feature performances by Abba NOW and Heart and Soul while there will also be a 'Proms in the Park' with the Vale Royal Youth Orchestra and songs from Welsh soprano Rhian-Carys Jones.

Last year's event drew in visitors across both days, and with this year's lineup eclipsing 2017's in terms of what's on, it's sure to be a great weekend of activities in Northwich.
